



Sports and PE Parent Short Survey

March 2018

A short survey was sent to parents, seeking their views on the Daily Mile following its implementation and into the take up of extracurricular clubs.

52 families within the school responded to the survey, representing each year group. 21 of the surveys (40%) were from families whose children were in receipt of Pupil Premium funding.

The key findings were:

Daily Mile

- All respondents stated that their children had talked positively about the Daily Mile at home.
- The children all see the benefits of the Daily Mile and were able to share this information with adults at home.
- The majority of parents (86%) felt that the Daily Mile had already helped their child to improve fitness. Others were not convinced that they had seen impact yet.
- 1 parent commented on the improved sleep of their child following the Daily Mile being introduced.
- Three parents commented on the increased confidence their children seemed to have following starting running every day. "My child is much more eager to do physical activity now".
- One parent suggested that we introduce more challenge within the Daily Mile so that the children can work towards specific achievements (running a certain number of laps etc).
- One parent suggested that the school invite families to join them for the Daily Mile.

Clubs

- Of the responses, 70% stated that their children currently attend clubs.
- 93% of the surveys agreed that the school offers a wide range of clubs.
- Other comments were:

- Some parents requested a wider range of activities and a greater variety. Suggestions were tennis and basketball.
- One parent requested that more Year Groups be able to access more of the clubs; at present, only some can access particular clubs.
- One parent commented, "After School Clubs are great! Thank you to all who make it happen!".

What we plan to do next

- Introduce new challenges and extra foci for pupils running the Daily Mile each week. This will be possible using the new track.
- A 'Run with your Child' afternoon has been planned for 4th May 2018. More details will be shared nearer the time.
- A wider variety of clubs has been organised for the Summer term 2018, to include cheerleading and Quidditch. In addition, a team games club is being offered, which will give pupils the chance to participate in a range of sports, including hockey, rugby and football.
- More of the clubs in the Summer term 2018 have been opened up to more year groups.
- We are exploring the opportunity to run a dance club, offered by an external agency.
- We are planning to create a PE and Sports termly newsletter, which will support families in accessing further opportunities out of school as well as celebrating achievements within.
