

How to support your child's learning from home.

Please read with your child at least 3 times a week and have your reading books/logs in every day. They will be changed every Thursday.	Practise with numbers up to 10. Working on number bonds and the patterns we can spot when adding and subtracting one digit numbers.
Carry out some family exercise. Go for a run, a brisk walk, play a sport or jump around the living room - anything that raises your heart rate. Take pictures and send them in for the children to share.	Phonics Play can be used to access a range of free activities for the children to complete.

Welcome back!

English

- Punctuation focus - Capital letter, full stops and finger spaces.
- Phonics/spellings - Phase 3 and 4. Letter formation.
- Reading focus - Daily reading. Can the children understand what the story is about and what has happened.
- Class stories - Puffin Peter
- Reading books will be changed every Thursday and will require three separate reading entereries into their reading logs. These books are to encourage being a 'fluent reader'. Children will be exposed to a range of other books during guided reading and story time at the end of the day.

Maths

- Composition of numbers: 0-5
- Reason about the location of numbers to 20 within the linear number system, including comparing $<$ $>$ and $=$
- Compose numbers to 10 from 2 parts, and partition numbers to 10 into parts, including recognising odd and even numbers
- Number formation

Science

- Topic - Animals including humans.
- Key areas of learning - Human features, human offspring and what humans and animals need to survive. The local environment and changes across the four seasons.

Personal, Social and Health Education

- Key skills - Being yourself. Working with other children, being kind and sharing.

Computing

- What is coding? Learning how instructions work, how a code executes and learning to plan a computer program

Geography

- Key skills -My school and local area. This unit builds on children's learning in EYFS about their classroom, school building and grounds.

History

- Changes in toys- past and present

Art

- Mark Making- exploring ways of drawing lines, patterns and creating art in the style of Paul Klee

- Does God want Christians to look after the world?

Physical Education

- Key skills - Year 1 will have cricket, team bonding and striking and fielding this term. PE will be Tuesday and Friday every week. Full kit is expected throughout the week.
