

How to support your child's learning from home.

Please read with your child at least 4 times a week and have your reading books/logs in every day. They will be changed every Thursday.	Practise with numbers up to 20. Working on number bonds and the patterns we can spot when adding and subtracting one and two digit numbers.
Carry out some family exercise. Go for a run, a brisk walk, play a sport or jump around the living room - anything that raises your heart rate. Take pictures and send them in for the children to share.	Phonics Play can be used to access a range of free activities for the children to complete.

Please ensure your child has their fluency book and orange reading log in school every day.

English

- Punctuation focus - Capital letter, full stops, finger spaces and conjunctions
- Phonics/spellings - Phase 5 and alternative sounds. Letter formation and joined up writing
- Reading focus - Daily reading. Can the children read a sentence fluently and understand the story
- Class story - *The Last NooNoo* and *How to wash a woolly mammoth*
- Reading books will be changed every Thursday and will require four separate reading entereries into their reading logs. These books are to encourage being a 'fluent reader'. Children will be exposed to a range of other books during guided reading and story time at the end of the day.
